


One (1) final proposal was submitted May 13, 2005, and this application was accepted, with an announcement on June 30, 2005:

Scientific Writing Workshop using Online Instructional Technology
Surgery, School of Medicine, \$40,000

This project will evaluate a combination of Web applications in an Online Scientific Writing Workshop focused on clinical research. The researchers will assess a combination of tools using Voice over the Internet Protocol, shared screen software, and the Manuscript Architect application developed by the researchers, to determine whether and to what degree the tools assist students in developing their scientific writing skills.
